## Description

It's time to return to a VBMWR tradition at the end of September. After a two year hiatus due to Covid 19 it's time for another Last Chance Camp-N-Ride. The summer crowds have gone home from the Osoyoos Lake Veterans Memorial Campground and we usually have most of the campground for ourselves. The nights are getting chilly but we normally have a campfire or two to gather around in the evenings. This camp has traditionally been well attended by both Canadian and American members and we hope to see some of our American friends again after a couple of years of separation. We benefit from some of the local knowledge and there have been a number of excellent day rides in the area in past years.

We have four campsites reserved close to the washroom facilities and some of these sites are powered. We can have three tents per site or an RV and two tents. Typically the park isn't too busy so if we get some more people we should be able to find sites for them. There are showers on site. Prices this year will be \$10 per tent per night and \$20 per RV per night (US Dollars) so if you could bring the correct change it would be appreciated as the club will be collecting and submitting the fees.

We're not sure of the restaurant situation in Oroville but in past years there have been a couple of restaurants in walking distance from the campground.

If you're riding down from Canada, don't forget your passport for the border crossing and you will need the Arrive Canada App on your smart phone for your trip home. Make sure you are familiar with the app and the requirements before you go.

## Description

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If you're coming from Canada, don't forget your **Passport or Enhanced Driver's License** as you'll need it to cross the border. The Border Custom's offices at Grand Forks and Cascade (hwy 395) are only open from 8 AM to 12 Midnight. The Nighthawk and Midway crossings are only open from 9 AM to 5 PM. However, the Oroville crossing is open 24 hours per day.

The park is located at the north end of **Oroville** and is well marked.
